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IFALPA Background



- IFALPA Position Paper Positive Safety Culture December 2021
 - Highlighted the importance of voluntary safety information, as an uninhibited flow and exchange of information is vital to improving safety.
 - Positive Safety Culture is the cornerstone to a successful SMS
- Current guidance does not require participation from experienced front-line employees through the SRA process
 - Emphasizes 'organizational experience' vs. 'operational experience'


Background from ICAO SMP



- ICAO Safety Management Panel Presented concepts to the ICAO SMP in May 2023
- Current risk assessment practices only involve handpicked employees with potentially limited practical operational knowledge of scenarios being assessed, resulting in possibly incomplete assessments
- Action by SMP: Consider the addition of guidance that supports the inclusion of representatives of current workers at the front-line of operations in the safety risk analysis process in the next revision of the SMM

For Consideration:

- Representation of front-line workers to foster an environment of transparency and reinforce safety culture concepts
- Flight crew perspective and operational experience contributing at multiple points of an SMS



Recommendations

- Transparency in company SRAs and front-line workers participation in SRAs
- Thorough risk assessments which includes all stakeholders to ensure indepth safety analysis


- Feedback from all groups should be encouraged and efforts should be made to create space for conversations
- Awareness of barriers to trusting culture



Results of Transparent Practices

- Prevent bias when making decisions and ensure operational experience is represented
- Consider sharing relevant SRAs with front line employees
 - Emphasize and explain the importance of risk controls
 - Generate buy-in
 - Foster credibility and trust





... TRUST is "the extent to which one is willing to ascribe good intentions to and have confidence in the words and actions of other people."






How can a Union help Safety?

Safety Programs (Assurance)

- ASAP (2000)
 - Labor association Signed MOU
- FOQA (2004)
 - Labor Association
 - Contractually addressed at nearly all carriers
- LOSA (2006)
 - Labor Association
 - Contractually addressed at most carriers
- SMS (2006)
 - There is no mention of Labor Association
 - Not contractually addressed

Safety Risk Management

- Risk tolerance and acceptance (Right to Manage)
- Informed risk assessments
 - Union/Labor participation
 - Union/Labor concerns considered
 - Union/Labor support
- Confidentiality/Sensitivity of risk assessments

Safety Promotions

- Union Communications
 - Email
 - Newsletter
 - Podcast
- Meetings
- Events/Road Shows
