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What is Work Together, Stay Apart about?

- In 2023 CAA launched the WTSA campaign
- Aimed at reducing airborne conflict events at unattended aerodromes
- Campaign built upon data both quantitative and qualitative
- Targeted campaign major focus area for ALL the Authority
- System wide focus multiple sectors and stakeholders






What led to the CAA being concerned about airborne conflict...


- Increased concern and feedback regards pilot behaviors at unattended aerodromes
- Outcomes from the Masterton midair and associated TAIC report recommendations
- Increasing critical near miss events
- Contributing factors associated in midair's were contributing in reported near miss events
- Identified need for a joined-up approach to improve safety





The data at the start of the campaign – May 23





- Since 2008: 7 fatalities in 3 midair's
- Since 2016: 437 reported events with 121 near collisions reported
- Critical events increasing
- 2023 data: Q1 & Q2 only (kick off point in campaign)

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
Common factors in reported occurrences

- Not following part 91 rules i.e. 91.227 ROW rule, 91.223 –
 Operating on & in the vicinity of an aerodrome
- Attitudes and behaviours not displaying good airmanship or circuit practices
- Use of non-standard procedures
- Ineffective look out
- Poor radio communications
- Failure to establish and maintain adequate situational awareness
- Number of events were occurring when one of the aircraft was joining the circuit

Common factors in New Zealand's last 3 midair events

- All aircraft were within the circuit area of an uncontrolled aerodrome
- All were on perfect VMC days (Visual Meteorological Conditions)
- 2 of the accidents were at 11:10 the other 15:30 all were in good daylight
- Elements of nonstandard procedures with each event
- All had a joining element
- All aircraft had either pitch, bank or both at the time of collision ie: manoeuvring
- Radio procedure faults clarity/effectiveness of communication, possibly active listening.
- All pilots and their aircraft were at their HOME aerodrome.

Our approach - WTSA Campaign

- Complex environment
- Airborne conflict is a shared risk
- System wide approach
- Used data to inform our approach to the campaign
- Behaviour change create awareness and desire
- Focused on four main areas outcomes to reflect
- Collaborating with industry at the heart of this campaign






